The students who sat exams in January for Applied Science, Health and Social Care and Sport received their results and there were some very happy students.

It has also been a productive half term for Year 12 and 13 students, completing their final set of PPEs or their first. The insight and feedback from staff will support them to make sure any knowledge gaps or exam technique are addressed in the last 6 weeks before the live exams, which are in May.

We welcomed Challenge Partners to the College in the week of the 10th March; our visitors were extremely positive about our learning community, broad curriculum, and enrichment opportunities as well as being able to clearly see that we really do stand by our ethos of 'Students First'. They were impressed by how articulate our students were in the student panels and lesson explorations:

"Students feel trusted to make decisions and are in charge of their revision and have the autonomy to start later and finish earlier, however most wanted to stay on site as they value the intervention and if they stay, they can go and ask teachers directly if unsure about anything! They did not feel that it was a consequence to attend intervention or have additional supervised study as they knew they were being supported to achieve good outcomes".

It is most definitely a compliment when a visitor says that they wish their children could have attended a college like ours.

As we move towards the next term, we have the Sixth Form 'Sports Day' events to look forward to on the 9th April and we'll see some students during Easter break at the subject masterclasses. There is still so much to come before the end of the academic year, including; Leavers Assembly for Year 13, HE evening 17th June, Awards evening 19th June, Sixth From Induction 26th June and students on 26th June, the Leavers Ball 27th June and HE Fayre at Nottingham University 2nd July as well as the final Trust performance of the academic year – Summer Fiesta from 25th to 26th June.

Sixth Form Update

I am sure most of you will agree that this term seems to have been quite a long one. That also means it has been a very busy and productive term especially as we get ever closer to and prepare for the business end of the year. There has been an incredible Trust Musical in the form of We Will Rock You for which we are supremely proud of all the talented Sixth Formers involved; we have had a second round of Year 13 PPE Results; the Careers Fair; Year 11 application interviews and Comic Relief to name but a few highlights.

Year 13 PPE Results and Final Reports

Just before the February half term our Year 13 students sat a second round of PPEs. Some of these were full papers, some were target sections or areas of papers that focussed on elements of the course subject staff felt would best benefit our students. The results of these PPEs, along with target and predicted grades have recently been shared with you as parents and carers. This report reflects the most up to date data giving the position of your son or daughter going into the last 8 weeks until the exam season begins. The clear message to students is that there is still time to make an impact in areas they feel they could improve. As we have said in the correspondence that accompanies the report, if there is anything you wish to discuss with your child's teachers please do get in touch. All students should be well into their revision timetable by now and preparing for those all-important end of year examinations. At this stage in the year students should be at full tilt in terms of their revision and use of independent study time.

Year 12 PPEs

Year 12 students are, as we are writing this, currently sitting their first round of formal PPEs. These exams are designed to see what information has stuck and been transferred to their long term memory and what still needs working on. The examinations cover everything they have learnt on their courses to date and the results will give a clear picture of where the students currently are. These examinations are vitally important for that reason. As we know, revision should be a constant process and certainly not something that should be left to the end of Year 13. There will be even more content to cover and master next year and it is important that this year's content is locked in as we move forward. We will be sharing the outcomes of the PPEs as soon as we can. As always there will be the opportunity to discuss results and outcomes with staff.

Year 12 students – considering university after A Level study?

We are now entering the phase where Year 12 students need to be planning and preparing for making their applications to universities in the Autumn Term of Year 13. There have already been sessions in the Life Skills programme to support students, including an overview of the Higher Education option and guidance on how to research courses. Coming up after Easter we have the following inputs:

- HE Information Evening For Parents (17 June)
- HE Fair in Nottingham (2 July)
- The University Admissions System (UCAS) explained (Life Skills lesson, June)

UCAS Workshop including a guide to writing your personal statement and logging in to the system (27 June). Students should continue to check Teams daily for information about university summer schools and other programmes that provide useful experiences to support applications and to seek out extra-curricular and super-curricular activities to bolster their applications.

University Open Days are advertised in College and students should also be looking out for these on university websites. We recommend students attend open events for any university they are seriously considering applying to.

Tutors will continue to provide advice and guidance to their tutees and additional support is available through our careers adviser and Mrs Edwards (Student Manager).

Year 11 Interview Process

The Sixth form Team have been very busy over the last few months interviewing a huge number of applicants from not only Wigston Academy but far and wide across the city and county, who wish to study here next year. It has been great to meet everyone and advise them about their choices for level 3 study. We have met some fantastic applicants who are eager and excited to join us at the end of the summer. As has been the trend over recent years we have seen an increase in the number of applications and an increase in the number of Year 11 students that are putting Wigston College as their first choice destination. This is really pleasing to see and wish all Year 11 applicants the very best of luck with their GCSE and level 2 courses.

A reminder that students must have paid the full amount of £42 for their ticket by Friday 9th May at the latest. The balance payments are via SCOpay and can be made in one transaction or in instalments.



- **Don't waste time** revise in ways proven to be effective

Apprenticeship Fair – 20th March

Year 11 students were given the valuable opportunity to participate in the Apprenticeship Careers fair at City Hall, Leicester. Students were given a presentation by a representative from ASK, highlighting the different levels of career opportunities and how different qualifications can be achieved through this pathway. In addition, students were given the chance of an interview with 2 or 3 different providers.

Students found it a really valuable experience and have gained an insight into the different fields available for apprenticeship pathways in the local area as well as how to apply for different apprenticeships.
